ORDER

Hon'ble Lt. Governor has suggested to incorporate the following safeguards also while implementing the cabinet decisions relating to Aam Aadmi Mohalla Clinics:

- a) The Selection of premises for setting up of AAMCs should be through a transparent and objective mechanism in such a way that the existing healthcare facilities are utilized in an optimum manner and the facilities are accessible to all, especially the weaker sections, without any duplication of scarce public resources.
- b) In case of private premises, the selection of premises and fixation of rent should be through a transparent open process as per prevalent PWD/CPWD norms.
- c) The doctors/ staff engaged in these clinics should be properly qualified and they should be engaged through a transparent mechanism.
- d) The administrative department must develop a sound mechanism to verify the number of footfalls claimed in the clinic. As discussed with Hon'ble Chief Minister and the Health Minister, the administrative department should evolve and migrate, within six months, to an online system based on Aadhaar/biometrics of patients. Adequate safeguards to ensure data integrity and privacy of patients must be put in place by the administrative department.
- e) All requisite instructions and codal formalities should be followed with proper oversight while incurring expenditure for procurement, supply and/ or outsourcing of services/ medicines/ goods. Quality of medicines should be ensured.
- f) Conditions laid down by the land owning agencies concerned for land use and construction of any temporary structure must be strictly followed. The portion of the land will be given on 'right to use only' basis. The Health Department shall not transfer, assign or otherwise part with the ownership or possession of the whole or any part of the said land in any manner.
- g) Wherever required, statutory permissions and no objection certificates must be obtained from the local bodies/department concerned.
- h) The functioning of these clinics should be regularly monitored by the Health Department to prevent any unfortunate happening.
